2019 Enrolments

Every year we send out a plea for those who live in zone and are bringing their children to our glorious school to please enrol early. While at primary school you can leave enrolling until close to the time of their fifth birthday. Intermediate and high school is very different.

We are limited in the number of students we have places for. We need to plan very carefully around staffing and student placement as we lose half and gain half our roll each year.

As an example, two years ago we had employed our staff, placed students in classes and had everything set for the new year. On the last week of the year we received thirty in zone enrolments out of the blue. At the eleventh hour, we had to scramble to employ a new teacher, find a space/room and reorganise classes.

We accept this is part and parcel of intermediate life, but acknowledge it is disruptive and difficult to get the right mix for those

I would like to thank the Board for the combined effort in carrying this project through. I can speak on their behalf when I say we will be very pleased to put this project behind us knowing all our efforts will continue to benefit our community for many years.

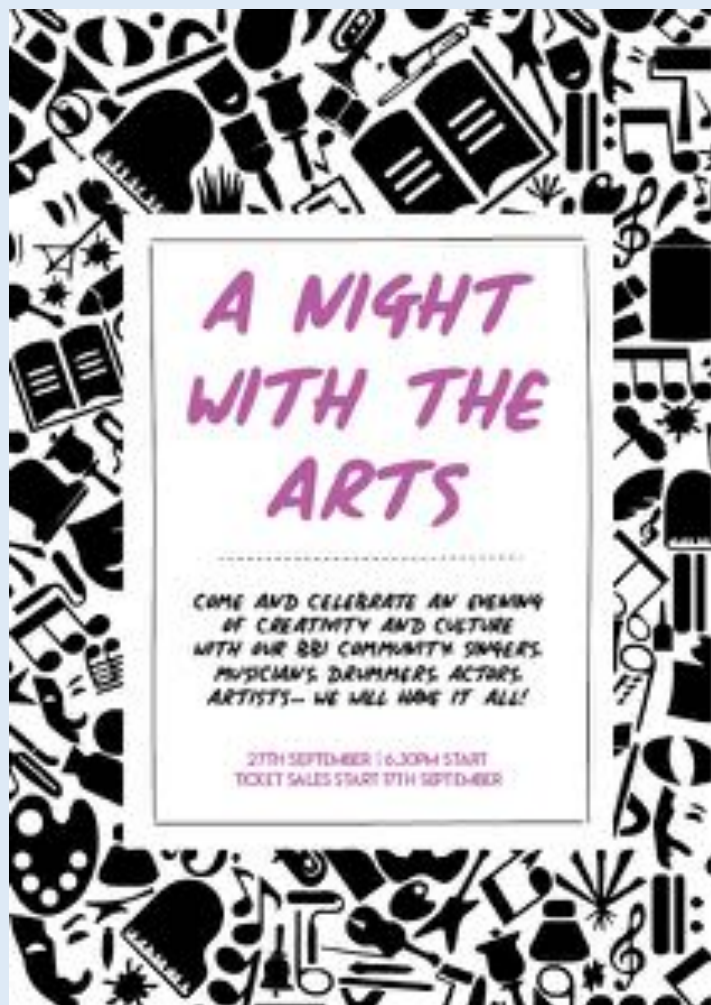
