Please ensure if your child arrives at school after 8:35am they sign in at the office.

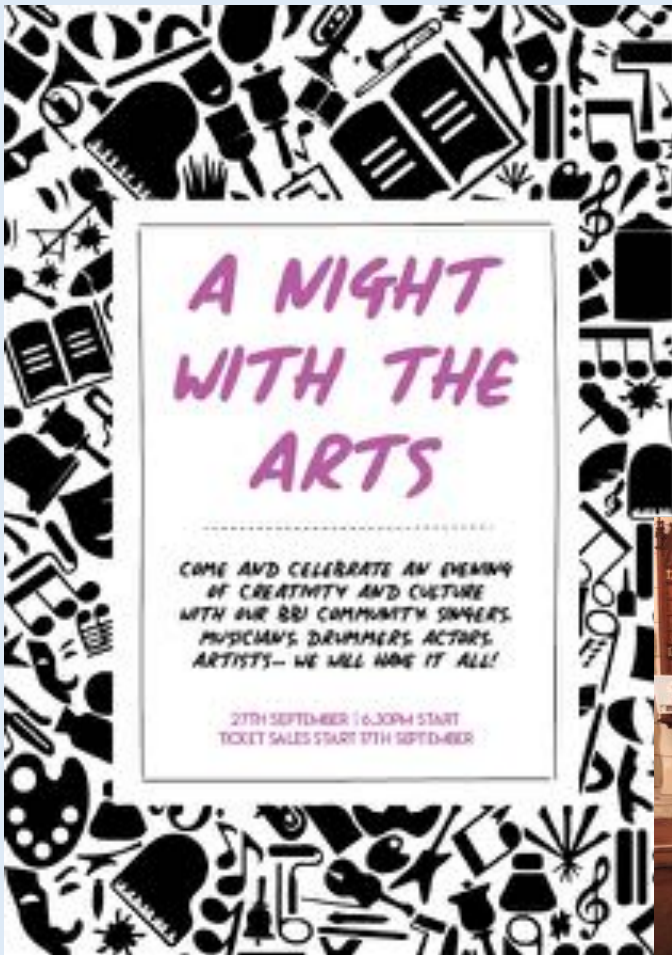
