Welcome to week eight of term two.

Significant upgrades start this Friday at BBI. Over the next six months we will be upgrading 23 classrooms and fitting them with new furniture. This will see the completion of a refit for all our classrooms and fully realise equitable access to teaching and learning resources for all students, both inside and outside of the class.

Our turnaround for each pair of classes will be one month, with another two prefab classes being completed over each holiday. Effectively we will be providing new teaching and learning spaces for 660 students.

Providing new furniture for 660 students means we have roughly 660 desks and chairs looking for new homes. These will be released as we start or complete each set of classes.
