It was a very different return to school last week as we welcomed 40% of students on site and 40% engaged in online learning. This was a tremendous start and way above the average.

We certainly appreciated that many parents wanted to follow a wait and see approach and to feel assured that school was well managed, with strong structures in place for student safety, before returning their child.

We had worked hard to ensure the highest level of risk assessment and elimination was in place and we started with girls adapting to the routine easily and a smooth start. The boys required a bit more managing and being reminded of the two metre rule while outside. By their second day the routine was established and the new norm was understood.

We are very clear and consistent on adhering to the safety requirements as set by the MoH. As teachers, we have our own children and wider whānau to consider and so we expect no less from our students.

Our one remaining area of focus lies with a small number of our students and their ability to self-manage social distancing outside. Delta is highly transmissible as an air borne pathogen and the requirements are for social distancing of two metres with a mask off when outside. We ask you to work with us as a community to strongly reinforce this with your child. Even when walking home with friends.

Everybody on site must follow the expectations we are mandated to install for all our community to be assured and to be safe. We continue to provide online learning and that is an option available to those who would prefer until the end of the year.

We expect more students on site as the year counts down and a natural desire to see the end of year off with friends and their teacher. We will continue to maintain the highest level of safety.

We can not thank our community enough for your support to enable us to run a smooth and efficient transfer back to school.

We have gained a very real appreciation of how lucky we were before Delta and how hard it has been for students overseas, where delta has been ongoing all year.

Our ongoing self-review cycle identified what works well.

- Well prepared. Pre-planned, well-resourced.
- Staff well-managed and in the right spaces
- Good, clear communication with staff & community.
- Teachers were well-planned for lessons, to engage students when they returned.
- Lots of happy students to see their peers and their teachers.
- Kept numbers at an appropriate, safe level
- New class upgrades working well.
- New outdoor spaces providing outdoor shade for maximum time outside & shade during break time.

Classroom upgrades

Next Friday will see the end of a significant 22 class upgrade that we have managed to complete over the lockdowns. We have managed this with minimal disruption to staff and students. Every class at BBI is now a modern learning environment, bright, fresh and providing equitable opportunities for every learner for decades to come.

As a board we are extremely proud of what we have achieved over the past four years. We have rebuilt every aspect of our school and created a beautiful and inviting community space with world class teaching.
