Welcome to week eight with two weeks until the end of the term. We have had amazing weather this term and this has been a great help in adapting to the Red light setting. Classes have been well ventilated, our facilities enable plenty of outdoor activity and we have managed to keep the disruption of Omicron to a minimum. Very few staff have been affected and increasingly fewer students are impacted.

We are returning to a semblance of normality and attendance is creeping back up to 90%. Our school target is 96% and what we usually sit at.

Every day matters

Every day matters is a government initiative to support schools to get students back into learning. To improve student wellbeing and academic outcomes.

For students to gain the numerous benefits of school, attendance is critical. Attending school helps set children up for life. Principals and their boards and staff help ensure that students, parents and caregivers all take student attendance seriously and that children go to school unless they are sick.

Nationally, the past few years have seen substantial drops in the number of students going to school 'regularly'.

Alongside a trend of high absences on Mondays and Fridays and nearing the end of term, there has been a worrying rise in the number of absences due to reported 'illness' and an equally worrying rise in the number of students who report 'skipping' school.

Because of the importance of attendance and these worrying trends, the Ministry's collection of school attendance data has changed. Until 2019, most schools submitted attendance data for Term 2 only. From 2020, attendance data is collected from schools every term. This term-by-term collection of attendance data is known as <u>Every Day Matters</u>.

Covid 19 has been incredibly disruptive to students learning. When students aren't present, they aren't learning. They are missing out on developing relationships, exploring their own development in a safe environment that is designed to support their emerging adolescence. School provides structure, routines being part of the group, and engagement.

Over the past two years covid has intensified a lot of fear and anxiety, which has led to parents keeping their children at home. This can become habit forming and can flow on to low resilience in students and a default setting of keeping students at home if it is rainy or at the slightest disruption.


BHBI always sees attendance as a priority. More so following any disruption from Covid. We will follow up and we will support all students at risk through poor attendance.

Each year, with a new cohort of students and whānau we need to push home the message that attendance is key to your child's success in their schooling life.

Low attendance remains a National Education priority. Data from last year shows the national attendance average for comparative schools in Auckland. BBI is represented by the diamond that sits way above the dark grey line that represents all NZ schools.
