#### Camp update

We have noticed a number of year 8 parents have not responded to the initial camp letter. As such the lower numbers will impact the experience we can provide our community. A reminder letter has been sent and we thank you for responding.

We totally understand any trepidation following the Abbey Caves tragedy and want to assure our community that as a fully compliant Education Outside the Classroom school (ERO compliance 2023), we work closely with our very experienced camp, their risk assessment team and skilled instructors.

Outdoor Education is fundamental to the personal growth of Rangitahi and Tamariki and a crucial component in their journeys through life. It is often the first introduction to the great outdoors for many New Zealanders and that connection to nature leads to numerous physical and mental health benefits – and often a lifelong love of the outdoors. When such a tragedy occurs, it is natural to pause and reflect.

Motutapu has asked us to reiterate that .....

- Our programs, activities, systems etc fall under the AAO Regulations, we hold Outdoors Mark (Premium) and are safety audited annually. Unlike School self run programs
- We are Centre based and all our equipment such as high ropes, climbing wall, flying fox are inspected at the required intervals by independent experts and our own team.
- We do not offer Caving, Canyoning, Whitewater Activities or similar.

We do not wish any student to miss out on the final **big** activity before they leave intermediate school and we know from many years of experience that the one thing we do not mix is activities and weather events.

#### **Garden Gnomes**

Alongside Whaea Laura and Miss Ward, our very own lunchtime Garden Gnomes club has been hard at work in the school gardens over the last two Terms! They have worked incredibly hard every week to clear weeds, plant new seedlings, edible herbs and flowers ready to be used in Food Technology lessons.

We are lucky enough to have some established planting in the garden beds as well as our school orchard area which provide an excellent learning space for Science, Enviro kids enrichment classes and for use in Food Technology.

Even though we are heading into Winter, the garden still has lots of life in it. In preparation for the colder months we have planted some of the garden beds with a green compost crop. Seeds from plants such as lupin, mustard, clover, oats, lucerne, broad beans and buckwheat are sown and then allowed to grow in the garden beds. The root systems loosen soil and before the plants flower they are dug back into the soil which adds much needed nitrogen and organic matter to replenish the soil. This should make excellent growing conditions in the spring and summer months. Come visit the garden area and look out for helpful labels designed by the Garden Gnome students to give you ideas for your own gardens!




#### **Battle of the Books**
