# Welcome to Term 2 week 9!

The conclusion of the week sees the completion and opening of the new school playground. This substantial project began at the start of last year, with the lobbying of the board by a group of mostly year seven students, led by Chloe Rm6 and Zara Rm7. They will officially open the playground on Monday morning.

The Board approved the petition and were planning to finance and plan the project. We focused our Knowledge-a-thon fundraising on this project in 2022 and our community were very generous in their support, raising a substantial amount.

The playground is built for Intermediate level students, with a focus on developing core and upper body strength (a key area we do not have in our daily fitness routine). It is packed with apparatus and lots of opportunities to be used in a variety of fun and fitness ways. Teachers will utilise their PE slots during week 10 for our students to explore the new playground and teach them how to use it safely.

The playground now fills an area of the field that was not drained, was muddy when it rained and an empty spot waiting to be filled.

By going big in our projects and with community support, we have transformed our school into a beautiful space that each cohort of whānau have given forward and benefited from those that have come before.




#### Ending the term on a high

















#### **Holiday reading**


