Blockhouse Bay Intermediate is both a Visible Learning and a School Wide Positive Behaviour for Learning school. We pride ourselves on our high expectations, our shared curriculum delivery and student led learning based around academic, physical, social and emotional learning.

Our values of Maanakitanga (Respect), Wairuatanga (Wellbeing), Rangitiratanga (Leadership) and Whaungatanga (Relationships) underpin our ethos of developing strong transitions, inclusive practice and strong academic outcomes.

Our policies and procedures sit within our website and underpin our delivery model. We expect all of our community to respect our values while in our place of learning.

Over the past few newsletters, there has been a common theme around our expectations in regards to behaviour, attendance and safety (both in school and at the school gate). These themes are a recurring focus for any Intermediate, where half the population changes every year and parents and students learn the way of the new school. This has become increasingly important post Covid, where there has been a noticeable decline in self-regulation amongst some when faced with challenging choices.

As a positive Behaviour for Learning School, we will continue to encourage positive choices around safety, behaviour and attendance.

Attendance

As we move through winter, attendance continues to remain a national priority. Attendance is a strategic priority within our annual plan and has remained so for many years.

Students cannot learn without being present. We cannot teach without students present. Our teachers work incredibly hard to design and deliver our quality curriculum for all students.

When we hear of schools nationally that have up to 60% of students not attending regularly, we can only empathise how crushing that would be for any teacher that prepares for 100% of students being in front of them and then having only 40% attend.


Because attendance sits within the strategic plan (along with our support structures that we have in place to support whanau to get their kids to school), our attendance sits above 90%.

We also know that by being ten minutes late every day has a very real and negative impact on student achievement and social emotional outcomes. 10 minutes a day equals 50 minutes a week equals 500 minutes a term. It all adds up.

When we break down why students are late, we see below that over half of lateness is because of sleeping in or because of traffic. Two big problems requiring simple solutions to solve a big barrier to learning.

We can only accelerate learning when we have learners to accelerate. We can't get students out of bed earlier, nor sort the traffic. But you can by adjusting routines, getting students with growing minds to bed early and encouraging them to self-regulate and get up and be prepared on time.

Thank you for your support. It means the world to them.
