Tēnā koutou, e te whānau o Blockhouse Bay Intermediate

As part of our ongoing work to address the impact of Covid, and to accelerate our students to prepare them for High School; in 2023, we have focused on measuring and strengthening our students motivation to learn, resilience and grit. This is an important measure, as it gives us solid data and insight as to how Covid (distance learning and the associated anxiety through isolation) continues to impact students learning post covid. We can alleviate this impact by specifically strengthening our students *motivation to learn, resilience* and *grit* when faced with challenges.

While Covid may be leaving our classrooms, it will be a number of years until we see the end of its impact in all schools. The key is being able to recognise this impact and how it is affecting our students.

Every day shows clear evidence of how we can support our students to focus on developing tools to help self-regulate (make sound decisions) when they are challenged, to develop resilience to manage the challenge and the grit to work though the challenge.

We also have strong evidence that our focus as a school throughout Covid and beyond has had a real and positive impact on growing successful learning.

In 2023 we were prepared for post covid and we knew communities would require extra support. Our Values and Positive Behaviour for Learning would be a strength. It would require our teachers and parent community to work together to ensure school was a safe and fun place to be. Where students are motivated to attend because their teachers know them and their whānau. The clearest evidence lies in our high attendance data.

We are excited about our work ahead as we support our students navigate their journey. We know BBI is a special place of learning and we had a tremendous turn out of our year 6 parents as they joined us to prepare the 2024 cohort transition to Intermediate.

Managing concerns

If your child comes to you with a challenge that occurred in or out of school, we encourage parents to take the time to listen and ask them to reflect. Encourage them to look at the two sides of the story and together explore their options. Encourage them to always come to you if they are unwilling to see the teacher first and to never seek solutions through social media. Try not to rescue them, rather focus on managing the challenge through options that develop resilience and grit.

If you need support, your first port of call is the classroom teacher. Our teachers know their students best and this is the best process to follow. If your child is unhappy with something that happened at school, we encourage you not to phone or email the office or senior management. Rather email and set up a time with the teacher and/or the whanau leader. They will know if senior management support is required. Remember we are a Values, strengths based school and we encourage our community to follow our process and respect our staff and community. Our processes are best practice, tried and true and there to support you.

The adolescent years can be challenging, there is a lot happening and a lot of emotions. Strengthening relationships through adolescence is key to smoother sailing through the teenage years.
