#### **Budget 2025**

We acknowledge the government's continued investment in education through Budget 2025, particularly the additional funding directed towards Learning Support. This includes increased staffing for the Learning Support Delivery Model and further funding for the Ongoing Resourcing Scheme (ORS), which supports students with high and complex needs.

These investments aim to better equip schools to meet diverse learner needs and ensure all students can access the support they need to thrive. We look forward to seeing how this will translate into practical support for our learners here at BBI.

A huge thank you to the nearly 50 families who joined us last night for our first Māori Hui and Pasifika Fono. It was an evening full of connection, kōrero and shared aspirations for our learners. We are grateful for the ongoing support from our whānau, and we look forward to continuing our partnership throughout the year.

As winter sets in, we ask for your continued support in keeping sick children at home. While we do our best to minimise disruption, the growing number of seasonal illnesses has made it increasingly difficult to secure day-to-day relievers on short notice.
